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The purpose of the National Interim Framework for Adult Protection Committees (APCs) on conducting a Significant Case Review (SCR) is to support a consistent approach to conducting Adult Protection Significant Case Reviews (APSCR) and improve the dissemination and application of learning both locally and nationally.

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Governance and Leadership

The WL APC is responsible for deciding whether a SCR is warranted using the criteria in the Framework, and for agreeing the manner in which the review is conducted on behalf of the Chief Officers Group (COG) or equivalent.

> Who can request a Significant 5 Case Review? Any agency who had contact with a deceased adult or an interest in an adult's wellbeing and safety can request that a case be considered for review by the WL APC where they consider the SCR criteria for a review is met.

WL Adult Protection Committee ICR/SCR Framework 7 - minute briefing

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The publication of the National Interim Framework for APCs on conducting a Significant Case Review provides guidance and can be viewed <u>here</u> Supporting and protecting adults at risk of harm is an inter-agency and inter-disciplinary responsibility supported strategically by an Adult Protection Committee (APC) or APCs when Cross-authority (Boundary) or although rare, Cross-UK cases circumstances are present.

The Framework is for all partners and outlines the interrelated processes and parallel processes proceeding in more than one organisation, as is needed in collaboration with partners, depending on the circumstances of the person.
